The Clark County Attorney's Office, in conjunction with Julie Briscoe, domestic violence victims' advocate, would like to thank Wes Moody and Barry Collins, on behalf of the Todds Road Stumblers for their monetary donation of \$155 to our Victims' Advocacy Program.

The Todds Road Stumblers spent many hours picking up litter from our roadways in western Clark County this spring while participating in the Bounty on Trash Program. The Bounty on Trash Program is a countywide event held annually in conjunction with the Commonwealth Cleanup, a statewide event held annually in March. The purpose of both events is to encourage citizens of our state to clean up their communities.

During the month-long event in Clark County, participants in the Bounty on Trash Program are given \$5 per bag of litter collected. The Todds Road Stumblers collected 35 bags of trash, picking up litter along the roads that make up their running route.
